

- No cafeteria
- Students bring lunch
- Support for F&R families
- Option to order a lunch to be delivered
- No sweets or soda, please
- Waste-free Lunch





Facilities

- Currently in rented facilities on two campuses, 1 mile apart in Downtown Raleigh.
- Plan is to have a new K-8 building in the next 3 years.
- We are building on Kindley Street, near Memorial Auditorium.
- We have selected our architect and general contractor, and are well into the permitting process, with hopes to break ground next year.
- We are launching a Capital Campaign and applying for bond financing.

Transportation

- No buses or transportation provided
- PTO assists with setting up carpools
- Carpool line is fast & easy
- Students walk when possible
- Parent drivers will be needed for some field experiences
 - Insurance and license on file
 - Signed forms on file





Atmosphere

- High sensory; lots of stimulation
- Flexible, responsive lessons
- Loud, boisterous, active, social classrooms
- Outside time whenever possible; daily at lunch/recess and often for class activities, too
- Frequent transitions, lots of movement and interaction with multiple educators
- Co-teaching model with lots of collaborative group work
- Responsive Classroom model = relationships and community are cornerstones

EC & Intervention Services

- We honor all IEPs and 504s
- We employ certified EC teachers as case managers and service providers, as well as EC teaching partners
- We contract with school psychologists, occupational and speech therapists, and other service providers as necessary
- We monitor scholars who are struggling and employ the MTSS process to see if specially designed instruction, accommodation, and/or modifications may be needed
- Please carefully consider our environment and your student's individual needs and learning style. We have found the co-teaching and expedition model, along with our downtown setting, to be challenging for some learners
- We are a small school with limited resources; please carefully consider whether we
 are a good option for your learner

Assessment: Standards Based Grading

Planning, instruction, and assessment focused on mastery of North Carolina Standard Course of Study

- Indicates progress on specific learning objectives rather than calculating averages
- Allows for an opportunity to circle back throughout the year
- Not a "one and done"
- Mastery often not accomplished until the end of the year





Student-led Portfolios

- 2-3 times a year, our scholars create a presentation for their families, teachers, and invited guests
- They choose work product examples to show their progress towards specific academic goals
- This gives students agency and ownership in their own academic progress
- In 8th grade, Passage Portfolio is given to a board of community representatives, past & present teachers, and family members



The Student's Day

- Crew/Morning Meeting
- Core Instruction in Language Arts, mapped closely to NC Standard Course of Study
 - Literacy focus in younger grades
 - Humanities approach in higher grades
- Core Instruction in Math, mapped closely to NC Standard Course of Study
- Expedition: Project Based cross-curriculum learning focused around science and social studies standards
- Global Arts
- Lunch and Recess
- FRIDAYS: Service Learning & Explorations (more on those in a moment!)



Crew and Morning Meeting

- Provides each student with a smaller core community and one adult for a closer relationship (1:19 for grades 2-8)
- Meets daily
- Builds
 - Relationships and Social Emotional Learning
 - Group cohesion
 - School and grade level norms
- Student oriented and often student directed

Middle School: Our Math Courses

- 6th, 7th, or 8th grade math
 - Students study the NC Essential Standards
 - Opportunities for above grade level enrichment and below grade level support
- **Math 1** High school course that requires a move of 1-2 grade levels up. First available for 7th graders
- Math 2 High school course for 8th graders who completed Math 1 in 7th grade.



Explorations

- Each Friday includes academics, service learning, and Explorations
- Explorations are short mini-courses like *Photography, Bike* Raleigh, Dance, Cooking Matters, Swimming, Creative Writing, Model UN, Basketball, Board Games, Movie Lovers, Outdoor Games, Drama, Touch Rugby, String Players, Sewing, etc
- Anyone can lead an Exploration on anything!



Clubs & Extracurriculars

- These change each year depending on student interest and adult advisors
- Past opportunities have included Science Olympiad, Bridge Building, Future Cities, Lego Club, Magic the Gathering, Student Ambassadors, Peer Advisors, Step Team, Museum Docents, and Drama Club
- We have no formal sports
 program, but offer competitive
 and club level activities like Girls
 on the Run, Cross Country, Aikido,
 and Ultimate Frisbee


Interested? Here Are Your Next Steps
