

On Friday, March 4th, Exploris held our annual lottery at 4:00 pm through a virtual Zoom event. Families are notified of their status and position on the wait list through our LotterEase system, and all accepted families are invited to a virtual information night on Wednesday, March 9th at 6:00 pm. Exploris Facilities Update

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After settling our lawsuit last fall, the Exploris Facilities Committee has narrowed our search to a top choice for a location for a new K-8 campus. Since the final negotiations are close to wrapping up but not yet completed, we are not yet at liberty to announce the new location, but it is not far from the current location of both the elementary and middle school campus, and would allow us to both renovate some of the existing structures on the site and build new. It provides for green space and plenty of parking. We have been working with a development firm for over a year now and have a design as well as bond financing in the works and will be ready to proceed once the final paperwork is completed. We are still on track to move into a new location in time for the 2024-2025 school year, and our leases at our current locations will take us through that additional time to build and develop. We look forward to being able to make a final announcement soon!

On the Wait List? Here's your next steps!

- We often see significant movement on our wait list, especially for grades Kindergarten and 6th
- Check your accounts often (or keep an eye on your email and check your spam folder!)
- Have the paperwork ready so you can move quickly: Once you are offered a seat from the waitlist, the deadline to respond gets shorter as we get closer to the school year.
- Come to the information sessions and be ready to make a quick decision if you get the call! No additional tours will be offered for families coming off the wait list.



SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL SCREENER

Our school cares about the wellbeing of all students and has programs designed to support improvement of their social emotional learning (SEL) and mental health competencies. To help monitor our students' SEL development, we periodically conduct school-wide screenings of students using the SSIS SEL Brief + Mental Health Scales. This measure can be completed by students, teachers, and/or parents and helps document students' current level of SEL as well as possible areas of emotional behavior concerns (EBC).
