Exploris Settles Property Lawsuit



The Exploris School is pleased to announce we have settled our lawsuit concerning the development on Kindley Street in downtown Raleigh, pending final approval on subdivision of the land parcel and on the bank's release of any liens on the property.

The settlement includes conveyance to Exploris of a parcel of land at the site of the planned Gateway project. Exploris will now be able to use that land parcel either as the location of our new school, or as a property we can sell to help finance a new K-8 school at a different location. We wish to thank our Facilities team, our Board members, and our Leadership team for their months of work to bring this matter to a successful conclusion.

What is Responsive Classroom?

RESPONSIVE CLASSROOM IS A STUDENT-CENTERED, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING APPROACH TO TEACHING AND DISCIPLINE. IT IS COMPRISED OF A SET OF RESEARCH, AND EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICES DESIGNED TO CREATE SAFE, JOYFUL, AND ENGAGING CLASSROOMS AND SCHOOL COMMUNITIES FOR BOTH STUDENTS AND TEACHERS.

IN EXPLORIS CLASSROOMS, THIS INCLUDES THE FOUR KEY DOMAINS OF ENGAGING ACADEMICS, POSITIVE COMMUNITY, EFFECTIVE MANAGEMENT, AND DEVELOPMENTAL RESPONSIVE TEACHING.



What's Going on with Kid's Behavior?

And How Exploris is Responding

Like schools across the country, Exploris has seen an uptick in behaviors that don't meet our school expectations, including backtalk, name calling, arguments, and even vandalism and fighting.

Students are working hard to process the stresses of being back in social environments. Our staff uses the Responsive Classroom techniques, which align with our Core Values and long-standing Exploris practices like Crew Time/Morning Meeting. Our responses to disruptive student behavior are centered on relationships, restorative practices, and logical consequences.

Please partner with us at home by reviewing with your scholars our Student Code of Conduct and reaching out to your crew teachers and counseling staff if we can help support you at home.

TIKTOK AND KIDS

Updates for Families



WHAT IS A TIKTOK "CHALLENGE"?


Basically, anything that goes "viral" and gets lots of people to attempt the same thing, often including filming and sharing it. Some are harmless like dance routines, some are helpful like the "Ice Bucket Challenge" from a few years ago, and others are harmful, like the "Devious Licks" challenges that encourage kids to vandalize and destroy school property and film their activities to post. Exploris Middle has dealt with some bathroom vandalism this fall connected to these challenges. Families, you are our best allies in stopping this behavior.

- Check and supervise what apps your scholars use
- Talk with them about the need to be Upstanders and not Bystanders
- Remind them of the very real consequences-from disciplinary to criminal-- that can come from school vandalism, aggression, or violence

HAVING FUN-- & STAYING SAFE!

By now nearly all of you will have encountered TikTok, a social medie app that lets you share and upload videos directly from your phone. TikTok can be a fun way to connect with other people and share content, from dances to funny pet videos to even some great educational uses. But like all social media, it can be abused and offers some dangers and pitfalls, especially for young users. TikTok is supposed to be used ONLY by students ages 13 and up, but a quick input of an older birthday often means even very young children are accessing content. Here's a few questions to ask if you are going to allow your scholar to use TikTok

- What are the privacy settings? TikTok lets you set usage to help protect your kids from predators and inappropriate content, including different settings for different ages, and a Family Pairing setting that allows adults to see all postings and content
- How much time are they spending on this and other apps? Screen addiction is a real and growing problem with our kids!

CARPOOL REMINDERS

HELP KEEP US ALL SAFE AND MOVING QUICKLY!



HOW TO HELP EVERYONE GET THROUGH CARPOOL

Most days, most of our cars, drivers, and kids get through the carpool line efficiently, and most importantly, safely. THANK YOU!

Lately we've noticed an uptick in drivers who are not following our carpool rules-- whether it's people new to driving carpool or drivers who need a refresher, please remember that our carpool pattern is designed by the City of Raleigh and we are legally obligated to follow the directions and traffic patterns. Here are a few key reminders:

- MAKE RIGHT TURNS ONLY, both arriving and leaving the schools. Yes, this might mean you have to drive around the block, but it's crucial to avoid backups and preventing accidents.
- DO NOT LOAD/UNLOAD ON THE SIDEWALK. Drivers must pull all the way into the carpool line in the front of the ES or in the Ugly Monkey Parking parking lot before children can enter or exit the vehicle
- WATCH FOR PEDESTRIANS. Please put down the cell phone and make sure you are watching for children and for directions from staff.





TEACHER HOURS

Earlier this year Exploris School Board member Leah Friedman led our staff through a discussion of communication protocols, specifically on how 24/7 access to work notifications and emails can disrupt work-life balance and lead to increased stress. The staff set some internal guidelines on how to limit workrelated communications outside of school hours.


For our families, we know sometimes evenings and weekends are when you have the most time to devote to contacting the school. We invite you to try to limit your communications with your crew teachers and with school staff to within school hours wherever possible, and to use some great new tools like "schedule send" to help manage communications so they don't arrive at all hours of the day and throughout weekends and breaks.

Please remember that per our Family & Student handbook, staff members have 24 to 48 hours to respond to messages, and that when emails arrive in the middle of the teaching day, staff may need some time to research, reflect, and/or investigate an issue before they are able to fully respond. If after that time period you have not yet received a reply, please do resend, because sometimes an email or phone message can get lost in the busy and often-interrupted course of the school day.

Our goal is always to be responsive and available to all our Exploris families, and we find our staff is often better able to do their main job of being present for your scholars if they have some more time to respond to emails and phone calls. Thank you for helping us stay connected to you in ways that balance all the responsibilities our staff are managing daily!


